

Detecting Fake News: A Quick Guide

Evaluate the Source's Credibility



Visit the website's "About Us" section to gather key details such as the site's founder, its stated mission, location, and establishment date. This information will help you assess the source's credibility.

Analyze the Headline and Content



Check the headline for emotionally loaded words. Review the article's body for similar language, and ensure it cites references, quotes experts, and links to credible sources.

Investigate the Author



Conduct a brief online search to verify the author's credentials and previous work. This will help you assess whether the author is trustworthy and knowledgeable on the subject.

Verify the Publication Date



Evaluate the publication date to determine the story's pertinence to present-day events.

Assess for Satirical Content



If the story seems too absurd or exaggerated, it could be a satirical piece. Confirm this by researching the website and the author's other works.

Reflect on Personal Bias

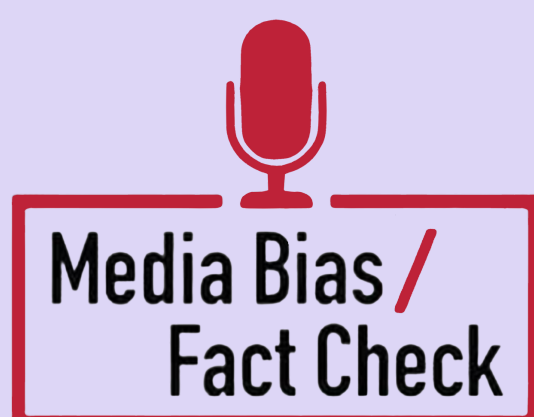


Take a moment to consider how your own beliefs and biases might be influencing your interpretation of the story. This self-awareness can help you approach the information more objectively.

Review Fact-Check History



Examine whether the website has failed any fact checks in the past five years to gauge its reliability.
